Common Name: The Narrow Leaved Eria

<P>Found in Sabah Borneo in hill riverine forests at elevations around 500 to 1800 meters as a small sized, warm to cool growing epiphyte with cylindrical to narrowly fusiform pseudobulbs enveloped by distinctly nerved, brown sheaths and carrying 2 to 3, distal, linear to linear-lanceolate, acute to acuminate, thin textured leaves that blooms in the fall, winter and spring? on a short, 2 to 4 flowered inflorescence arising from the sunken pits on the upper internode of the stem with ovate, acute, greenish vellow floral bracts.

This is a new combination that has now been published 3/21/15 and is legal by new regs with XVIII INTERNATIONAL BOTANICAL CONGRESS, MELBOURNE, 18-22 JULY 2011.
